There was an error identified which has been corrected in the following revision:

Revision 8 December 2022. An error was identified in Appendix 4, Table 7: ICUs and combined unit profiles (2021) and Table 8: HDU profiles (2021) with the heading description of Column 5. The data is for the whole WTE of each unit and not per level 3 or 2 bed as previously published. The impact of this would result in the over counting of nurses per each unit. Please note no figures within the Tables have required updating and as at 8/12/22 the correct heading has been published.

Mela Upgrade:

- The test system is almost ready for role out, the central team with the help of the vice chair of SICSAG have been working closely with Mela to get the data schema ready. We have added additional tool tips that we hope will clarify requirements for data entry these may need to be changed once the staff start using the test system any feedback will be to phs.sicsag@phs.scot, we will coordinate with Mela to make these changes.
- There are 3 health boards who have the new server ready and we are working to try and get the rest ready at the beginning of 2023.
- Once the server is ready the test version will be uploaded for training and feedback and the first migration of historic data will take place. During the test phase it is really important that all users have access and training and that any feedback on functionality is reported to Mela as changes can be made until the go live happens.
- Once the PHS server is ready there will be a planned go live date at which point all units will swap over to the new system - this needs to be done on the same day due to the bed bureau function for ICU which will be hosted on the PHS server. This is estimated to be around the end of March 2023.
- When the new system is up and running the remaining historic data will be migrated.
